Course Name: Religion 4

Grade: 4

Text: Faith and Life: *Jesus Our Guide* (FL) *The Baltimore Catechism I* (BC)

The Bible (RSV-Catholic) or a Catholic children's Bible

Lives of the Saints **Prerequisite**: None

Description:

This course is the study of salvation history, including Old Testament history and the life of grace found in the sacraments. Memorization of prayers continues.

Objectives:

- 1. Recite all answers to the Baltimore Catechism questions for lessons assigned.
- 2. Recite basic prayers in English; Sign of the Cross, Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be, Table Blessing, Apostles Creed, Prayer to Guardian Angel, Morning Offering (long), Salve Regina, Prayer to St. Michael, Act of Contrition, Acts of Faith, Hope and Love, Nicene Creed, Eucharistic Sacred Heart Prayer (below) and be able to pray the Rosary.
- 3. Know the Old Testament Stories of the Fall, the Flood, Tower of Babel, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Joshua, Samson, Ruth, Samuel, Saul, David, Solomon, Isaiah and Babylon.
- 4. Know what each commandment requires and forbids.
- 5. Understand Jesus' nature and His death, resurrection and ascension.
- 6. Know about Mass and the sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist, as well as the sacraments in general.
- 7. Understand about the authority of the Church and the nature of the Holy Spirit.

Description:

An elementary mathematics course that reviews basics taught in Math 3, introduces fractions and decimals, teaches more difficult multiplication and division, and builds on measurement and geometry.

- 1. To master material presented in Saxon Math 5/4.
- 2. Students must have complete mastery of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts.

Description:

A course to learn important Catholic prayers and songs in Latin, as well as to learn basic vocabulary.

Objectives:

Students will memorize and pray aloud important Catholic prayers and songs in Latin. They will also learn some basic vocabulary by memorizing words and by reading simple stories in Latin.

Course: Music 4

Grade: 4

Experience Classical Music:

Students will:

- Listen to classical works from 600 A.D. 1900 A.D.
- Demonstrate an understanding of meter utilizing conducting patterns
- Learn history of composers studied
- Identify orchestral instruments by sight, sound and family
- Describe musical characteristics using vocabulary

Elements of Music/ Theory:

- Demonstrate understanding of form
 - o Introduction
 - o Coda
 - Da capo al fine
- Read rhythms using counting method that places beat within the meter.
- Write beats in music using counting system
- Set-up music on staff paper including
 - o Bar lines
 - o G clef
 - o F clef
 - Meter marking
 - Read melodies using note names and solfege
- Write melodies using note names
- Recognize and name notes for 2 octaves from C1-C3

- Discriminate between
 - Fast/ slow (see about grades)
- Understand
 - o Tonic
 - o Major scale- half step vs. whole steps
 - Octave
 - o Ostinato
 - o Descant
- Recognize and define dynamic markings and articulations
 - o Piano
 - Forte
 - o Legato
 - Staccato
- Understand dotted rests and notes
- Recognize and name string, brass, woodwind and percussion families
- Recognize and identify timbre and phrasing

Creativity/ Expression/ Performance

Students will:

- Sing major scale using solfege
- Move expressively to music
- Continue to learn/recite rhythm in speech but convert to counting system
- Play rhythms and melodies on pitched and non-pitched instruments
- Sing rounds and canons
- Improvise rhythms and melodies
- Compose and perform simple rhythms and melodies
- Subdivide beats aurally and on instruments
- Match pitches
- Practice good audience etiquette
- Continue recorder instruction
 - Tongue articulation
 - o Perform while reading accurate pitches and rhythm
 - o Improve intonation
 - Improve tone quality
- Perform Gregorian Chant while looking a notation

Course Name: Reading 4

Grade: 4

Text: This Is Our Land

A Book of Gladness **Prerequisite:** Reading 3

Description:

Reading 4 is a fourth-grade level reading course in the **mechanics** of reading. The first semester book is a literature anthology for young readers. Included are poems, short stories, excerpts or adaptations from longer works, fairy tales and Bible stories. Authors range from Aesop to Beverly Cleary, from A. A. Milne to Rudyard Kipling. The second semester book contains short stories and poems about the saints and other famous Catholic figures, as well as fictional morality stories.

Objectives:

Students will be able to:

- 1. Use the learned phonograms to read words.
- 2. Recognize punctuation markings in order to read with expression.
- 3. Read at a steady pace.

- 4. Annunciate words clearly.
- 5. Orally summarize main points from reading.
- 6. Ask and answer what, how, why and what-if questions.

Scope & Sequence:

This Is Our Land introduces 726 new words, and is a book of selections from classic children's literature. A Book of Gladness provides a plateau for reinforcement.

Description:

This course combines Literature, Poetry and Penmanship

Objectives:

- Students will gain an appreciation for the beauty of great children's literature by listening to it being read aloud by the teacher, as well as reading by themselves.
- Students will practice writing the small and capital cursive alphabet neatly.
- Students will take dictation from great literature, write in their copybooks, and illustrate.
- Students will memorize and recite some of the poetry, literature or Bible verses they copy.
- Students will learn about great saints and figures in early American history.
- Students will be taken to the library once per week to select a book to read on their own.
- Students will add to their poetry notebooks.
- Orally summarize main points from reading.
- Ask and answer what, how, why and what-if questions.

Scope & Sequence:

- 1. Cursive handwriting will be practiced throughout the year. Students will be completing all their work in cursive instead of printing beginning the first day of school.
- 2. Selections of poetry, four per quarter, will be committed to memory from Berquist. One each quarter will be entered in copybooks and illustrated. (Early Years or Grammatical, pp. 19-141)

- 3. Teacher will read aloud to the students from works of literature, books about the saints and books about historical figures.
- 4. Students will read some simpler books on their own.

Course Name: History/Geography 4

Grade: 4

Text: Philip J. Furlong: *Our Pioneers & Patriots* (Units 7-11)

Fox: Map Skills D (Continental Press) The Big Pennsylvania Activity Book.

Prerequisite: None

Description:

History 4 is an elementary course in modern American history and Pennsylvania history, as well as map skills.

Objectives:

- To present 19th century United States history in a "simple, yet interesting manner". New terms, which expand children's vocabulary, are explained, persons important to each era are introduced, important dates to remember are included, and students have the opportunity to gain a widened knowledge of geography in places of historic interest.
- 2. Students will also memorize key dates in U. S. History.
- 3. Memorization of the U.S. Presidents in order.
- 4. Students will enhance their ability to use maps and globes.
- 5. Students will know the basics of the history of Pennsylvania.
